Membership Dues should have been paid last July. Over 60 members are still to pay – are you one? Our Treasurer Brad Baker has done another excellent job of balancing our books – so much so that we were able to reduce fees to \$30 for the current year.

Our new Stamp and Cover Collectors Forum was introduced during the past year and is convened by Dr Ian Sadler. This meeting takes place at 2.00pm on the first Wednesday of each month and has been attracting 8 to 10 people each time. This a great opportunity to learn from more experienced members on a wide range of topics which is designed to improve your collecting. My next task to complete before Christmas is to plan the Display program for the next year. Please make an effort to attend these meetings on the second

Tuesday of each month as you are going to see some world class exhibits – several of them have achieved Gold at an international level.

Reports from the Annual General Meeting

President's Report – 2021/2022

The society has recovered well from the pandemic interruptions of this time last year. Auctions restarted in November and both catalogued and uncatalogued auctions have been well attended with lively bidding. The commission from these auctions is, of course, what keeps our society going and a big thankyou to all of the Sales Branch and especially to Marco Turco who has taken over the extra role of sorting the auction numbers and making sure this all goes smoothly. A mention here to Henry Warren and Devin Trussell who volunteered to try to sort out the computing side and finally to Deb Harms who has now got this side of the auctions running well.

I thank all the Committee for their efforts and support during the year but particularly to Stephen Bradford, our Secretary, who keeps us all informed of the various happenings in the society. He also, of course, maintains the minutes and the agendas of the meetings so that we can function efficiently. Also to Brad Baker, our treasurer, who handles all the difficulties of insurance, rates taxes, people paying into the wrong accounts and so on but has also been our membership secretary for this year.

The newly formed Stamp and Collectors' Forum has been meeting regularly and I thank Ian Sadler for setting this up as well as organising and chairing the Tuesday Philatelic meetings. The Philatelic and Display meetings have, however, been a bit of a concern because the numbers attending have been fairly low despite the high quality of presenters. John Young's China display, for example, was a totally unique opportunity for members to see this very rare collection but only 9 members turned up. We will be looking at ways of attracting more members to these events next year but please attend the upcoming displays by Brad Baker in October and John Hewson in November.

The highlight of the year for me was the naming of this hall "The Wells Hall" in honour and memory of our eminent past president and tireless contributor to many different areas of the society, especially most recently with the exchange books, Dr William Wells.

I have already acknowledged and thanked in my recent newsletter our auctioneer and daytime meeting organiser, John Rennie, and the many helpers at the auctions and I thank them publicly again.

I look forward to the upcoming year under the new President and my continuing role on the committee.

Treasurer's Report

The return to business after Covid saw the Society return to profits with a profit of \$5810 this year compared to the loss of \$1400 last year. Commissions from auctions were up from \$11,873 last year to \$28,189 this year. Great work from all those concerned.

Expenses also increased from \$31,354 last year to \$45,048. Maintenance \$11,610 was the largest expense as it included the painting of the exterior of the Neufeld Hall. Painting of the Williams Well Hall will likely be undertaken within the next 12 months.

Membership fees at \$12,580 just covered Insurance \$7,335 and Council Rates \$4,799. The Club no longer pays Land Tax as Clubs that are not "Men Only" are excused from Land Tax. The removal of this expense has allowed the Club to reduce its annual membership fees to \$30. So please sign your wives and girlfriends as members to ensure the Club retains this status!

Sales Branch Report

Sales Branch continues to provide an excellent outlet for selling philatelic items for BPS through uncatalogued auctions (17 per year), catalogued auctions (3 per year) and mint stamps sold for postage by Richard Sealey. All outlets continue to provide steady revenue.

The uncatalogued auctions are generating increasing income through commission, providing the Society with funds for ongoing expenses. Catalogue auctions are continuing to sell at about 70% of the listed items.

Sales Branch team of Jim Bell, Ross Newton, David Shutler, Richard Sealey and Marco Turco have been kept

busy collecting deceased estate material an increasing number of which are coming via the Society website.

Sales Branch are approaching 600 vendors whom we have dealt with in recent years.

On a sombre note, we advise all members to inform their families of their wishes for disposal of their collections to avoid any possible conflicts of interest.

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge all members of the Sales Branch team for a continuing strong effort supporting the Society.
