Brighton Philatelic Society Auctions

Following a longish break due to Covid, the Sales Branch have put together a number of successful auctions for the membership. At our latest catalogued auction (in July) we realized record sales \$s with 79% of lots selling. The attendance of 80 people would also be the largest attendance at any stamp auction in Australia this year.

We auction on the first Saturday of each month at 1pm, with viewing from 9am and on the fourth Tuesday night at 7pm with viewing from 5pm.

Members who attend report that the fellowship with other collectors in a relaxed atmosphere is a highlight.

The kitchen is well stocked with tea, coffee, cakes, biscuits etc. Auctioneer, John Rennie, moves along the auction at a good pace, trying to achieve 250 lots per hour. Minimum lot value for all auctions is now \$5 with bidding increments of \$1 +

Now might be the time to clean out your surplus material. Items priced reasonably are selling as our clearance rates rarely are less than 70% of lots offered. Overpriced or lower quality material is not popular.

We are also being consigned estates and collections that have been untouched for years. Our team collecting these lots do so with compassion & freely give of their knowledge to the descendants of the original owner. None of us are experts in everything so keep an eye out for a bargain. Estimates are based on the Sales Branch or submitters estimates. It is easy to criticize us getting it wrong but some viewers spend an hour examining a lot so expertise and thoroughness can be rewarded.

Tips and Tricks

When members of the Sales Branch visit prospective vendors, we are often asked for a rough valuation. When we give a figure, the person often says but these stamps are selling much higher on eBay. But are they?

When checking prices on eBay you need to be looking in the SOLD tab down the left-hand side. Sellers can ask anything they like but to see what people are actually achieving you must look at that figure.

Also check the vendors ID with the numbers of sales recorded. Many sellers are blacklisted by eBay but simply re-appear under another ID. So be wary of anyone with a very low number of sales.

PHILATELIC QUIZ: WHAT'S WRONG WITH THIS COVER

Someone recently bought the following cover, thinking they had purchased a rare item for a reasonable (but significant) price but then thinking maybe it was too good to be true. So, he checked this cover out with Ed Wolf, a Director of PHILAS and a world expert on Aero philately who pointed out 5 things in relation to this cover. How many things can you spot?





Feedback from Ed Wolf was as follows:

- A. It did not go by Airmail to San Francisco on a 7d Australian postage rate!
- B. It did travel across America by air on the 15c postage paid there.
- C. There is no catapult marking on the cover.
- D. It was forwarded by air from Hanover to Hamburg.
- E. It is a made up cover by a QLD dealer with an airmail etiquette from a different flight.

Advice for members contemplating a purchase of a "rare" item in future:

- 1. Research your item
 - Look through BPS' Library we have a number of books on a large range of topics. See if there is something that will address your question
 - Research online there are a number of tools and sites, such as Stampboards (https://www.stampboards.com/) where a number of people can assist
 - Utilise online social media join a group, such as on Facebook and ask members if they can assist. An example Facebook site is "Australian Stamp Collector"

- 2. If you don't know, ask us at BPS! Contact a BPS committee member. If we cannot help, or cannot provide a library reference, we should be able to refer you to someone who is expert in the area; we have a large club with a number of specialists.
- 3. For items that are expensive, request a certificate validating the item.
