But it is worthwhile mentioning that so much happens behind the scenes to run our club and I am extremely grateful for the help and support provided to me and club operations over the last 12 months by everyone involved, especially our Committee. Our Committee work tirelessly to keep club operations running smoothly and their time and commitment is truly appreciated. We also have other valued helpers who support ongoing club activities including the significant work done by non-committee contributors notably John Rennie (Daytime meeting, auctioneer) and Howard Ellis (Metro Exchange Branch) so again I'd like to say Thank You.

Treasurer's Report

The Society recorded a loss of \$5,569 for the year ended 30th June 2024.

Income totalling \$68,449 was received in that period. The major items included were Auction Commissions \$30,725, Interest Received \$15,535 and Membership Subscriptions \$11,975.

Expenses of \$74,069 were incurred. The major items included here are Cleaning \$5,775, Insurance \$8,518, Council Rates \$4,838 and Repairs & Maintenance – Building \$35,991, which related to the Molander Room floor and sub-floor.

It should be noted that the Membership Subscriptions do not cover the fixed expenses of Insurance and Council Rates, costs that we incur whether meetings are held or not.

The Society has assets of \$3,429,013, Liabilities of \$36,222 and Members' Reserves of \$3,392,791.

BriPhil House was revalued by the Committee to \$3,130,397 including some improvements.

For income tax purposes the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) in the past has always assessed the Society to be a non-profit organisation and exempt from income tax. The ATO is now reviewing the Doctrine of Mutuality under which the Society receives its tax exempt status. The Society will seek advice regarding its tax exempt status.

The Sales Branch Convenor, Jim Bell, who has done this role for the last 18 years, is retiring but will remain a member of the Sales Branch. We thank Jim, and Richard Sealey, for their incredible dedication and work that they have done in building up the Sales Branch to the point where it is highly respected and gets recommendations from other institutions. The present members of the Sales Branch are Ross Newton, Richard Sealey, Jim Bell and David Shutler who is the new Sales Branch Convenor. We welcome Andrew Ballis to the Sales Branch who is initially in an advisory capacity. We hope he will become a full-time member in the future. We also thank outgoing member Marco Turco for his unceasing efforts and many initiatives that have improved the running of auctions and organisation of the lots.

The Sales Branch organises 19 Uncatalogued auctions and 3 Catalogued Auctions each year. This is an immense and ongoing task - considering that all the Sales Branch are volunteers the standard has remained high and gives the members of the Society a large and varied choice of items to purchase and improve their collections. It also provides, through the commission on sales, a steady source of income that means the Club does not have to constantly dip into the reserve funds.

The auctions could not work without the additional assistance of many others – our auctioneer John Rennie, Stephen Bradford, Jack Van Beveren, Neil Petrass, Keith

Burch, Robbie Robertson, Frank Barrett, Anthony O'Brien, Doug Kennedy, John Adamson, Michael Tonta, Matthew Robertson (a reserve auctioneer) and of the utmost importance the computer systems run by Deb Harms and assisted by Gerard McCulloch. We trust the Society members will continue to be polite and respect all helpers. Any comments or advice regarding the organisation of the Sales Branch should be addressed solely to the Sales Branch Convenor.

We look forward to another successful year and ask Society members to cooperate and assist where possible to maintain the wonderful opportunities that are provided by this section of the Society.

Membership Report

Membership over the last 12 months is going well, with membership at 30th June 2024 at 346 members; 10 additional members than the same time last year. After spending some time following up overdue memberships we currently only have 14 members who have not paid the previous years' memberships.

We have seen an increase in attendance at our auctions primarily, but have also seen an increase in attendance at our Daytime meetings and participation in club events such as our Member Display nights which we believe is due to our communications strategy including emails (to existing members) and our presence on social media platforms (reaching potential new members) via Facebook, Instagram and X. Thankyou to Vanessa Henry and Gerard McCulloch for maintaining our social media presence.

Membership is still \$40 for the current year but we will review, as per my comments in the June Bulletin, the possibility of charging 2-tier membership next year — email versus postal mailouts — due to rising costs of printing and distribution of the bulletin and auction catalogues.

Last October we held a Club Fair, the first since COVID, which was well attended by members. We are planning for a similar event to occur in the future and planning will commence shortly. We hold a number of activities for our membership but would love to hear from members if there are activities they would like to see occur that hasn't to date. All feedback is welcome and will be considered.
